An eligibility ruling must be obtained from the Committee through the Executive Director. Principals who have Foreign Exchange Students from a program not listed on the recognized list of the Council on Standards for International Educational Travel (CSIET) or entering member schools under no program that desire to participate in interscholastic athletics are required to communicate with the Executive Director to seek eligibility for such students, and they must provide the following information on a form (**Form II**) provided by the RIIL.

The earliest date these students can become eligible for competition is after they have obtained a favorable eligibility ruling from the Committee, and after they have served the fifty percent (50%) of the *League* schedule waiting period in each sport in which they participated on a varsity level.

You are reminded that this student is ineligible to represent your school in interscholastic athletics until granted a waiver by the RIIL Principals' Committee on Athletics. Schools using ineligible student-athletes shall forfeit all games and contests in which the ineligible student participates in accordance with Article 6, Section 5C of the RIIL Rules and Regulations.

Note: Schools are responsible for determining if a foreign student has participated in specific sports. To assist our schools in evaluating sport participation that is equivalent to or a higher level than our scholastic sports program in foreign countries where there is not a scholastic athletic program, the following guidelines are offered. The elements listed can be used to judge an athlete's previous experience in a specific sport. All elements need not be present to be a comparable experience.

- The athletic contests are found and cannot be considered "pick-up" games.
- Competition is organized and scheduled between teams / individuals / organizations.
- Recognized rules are followed
- Scores are kept
- Equipment and/or facilities and/or uniforms are provided by a sponsor (club, school, town, agency)
- Competitions are officiated by qualified individuals
- Competitions are against a variety of opponents organized in a similar manner (clubs, towns, regions, nations)
- Individuals are selected through tryout sessions and/or past performance. There is a formality to the selection process and not a "pick-up, ad hoc, informal selection process.
